



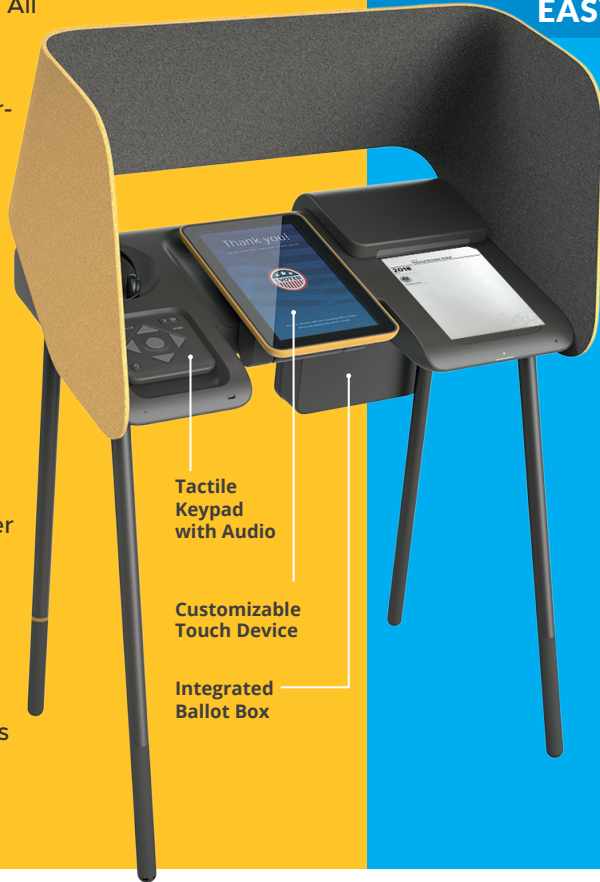

AN INNOVATIVE VOTER-CENTERED APPROACH TO VOTING FOR LOS ANGELES

An innovative voter-centered approach to voting for Los Angeles County, Voting Solutions for All People (VSAP) was developed by the LA County Registrar-Recorder/County Clerk in 2009 to address an aging voting system and an increasingly large and complex electorate.

The new voting model will move us away from reliance on pre-printed paper rosters and in its place provide real time access to the full voter database at all voting locations that makes same-day voter registration easier.

REGISTER TO VOTE

You may register to vote in California if you are:




-  - United States citizen
-  - At least 18 years of age or older on or before Election Day
-  - Not in prison/parole for a felony

You may pre-register to vote in California if you are:

-  - 16 or 17 years old
-  - United States citizen

California youth who pre-register to vote will have their registration become active once they turn 18 years old.

HOW TO REGISTER

-  - Visit RegisterToVote.ca.gov to complete a voter registration form online.
-  - Call **(800) 815-2666 option #2**
-  - Complete a voter registration form provided at most City of Los Angeles, state, and federal government buildings.



WHEN TO REGISTER

Voter registration deadline is 15 days before an election. Same-day registration may be available up to Election Day at voting centers. (Subject to state regulation changes.)

Update your registration to vote if you:

- Move to a different address
- Change your name
- Change your political party affiliation
- Complete a felony sentence and are not on parole
- Want to receive official election-related materials in a different language

VOTE-BY-MAIL/ PERMANENT VOTE-BY-MAIL

Any registered voter may vote using a Vote-By-Mail ballot instead of going to the polls on Election Day.

To request a Vote-By-Mail ballot:

- Complete a Vote-By-Mail form on the back cover of the sample ballot.

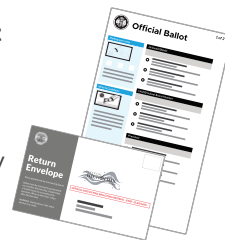
To become a permanent Vote-By-Mail voter:

- Visit LAVote.net to complete a form online.
- Complete a voter registration form and mark the yes box on line #7.

Ballots begin to be mailed 29 days before an election.

Return a Vote-By-Mail Ballot

- Mail the Vote-By-Mail ballot with pre-paid postage envelope.
- Drop off the ballot at any Vote Center or at any Vote-By-Mail drop box.

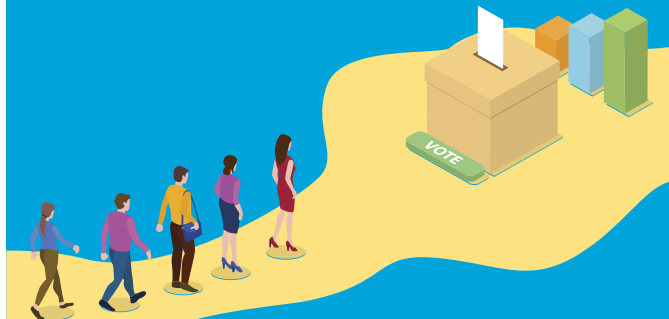

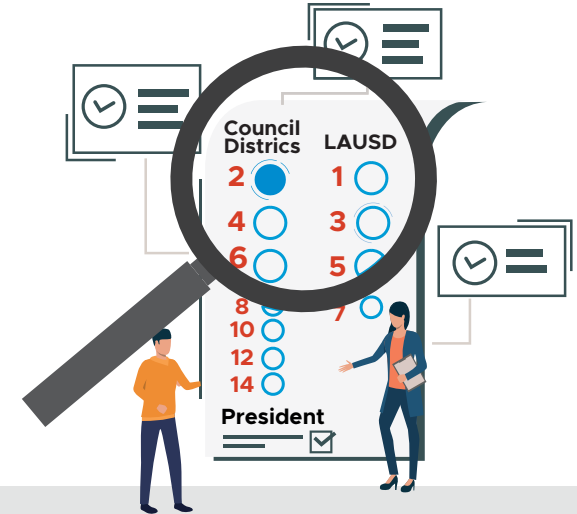
In 2020, City seats will be on top of the ballot.

VOTE CENTERS

In 2020, Los Angeles County will transition from polling places to vote centers. This new model will allow voters to cast a ballot at any vote center location in LA County over an 11-day period.

- Many vote centers are open 11 days
- All vote centers open 4 days, including Election Day
- 1,000 voting centers throughout LA County
- LA City Residents can vote at any vote center in LA County
- Electronic rosters accessing data in real time and allows for same day registration
- Vote-By-Mail drop off
